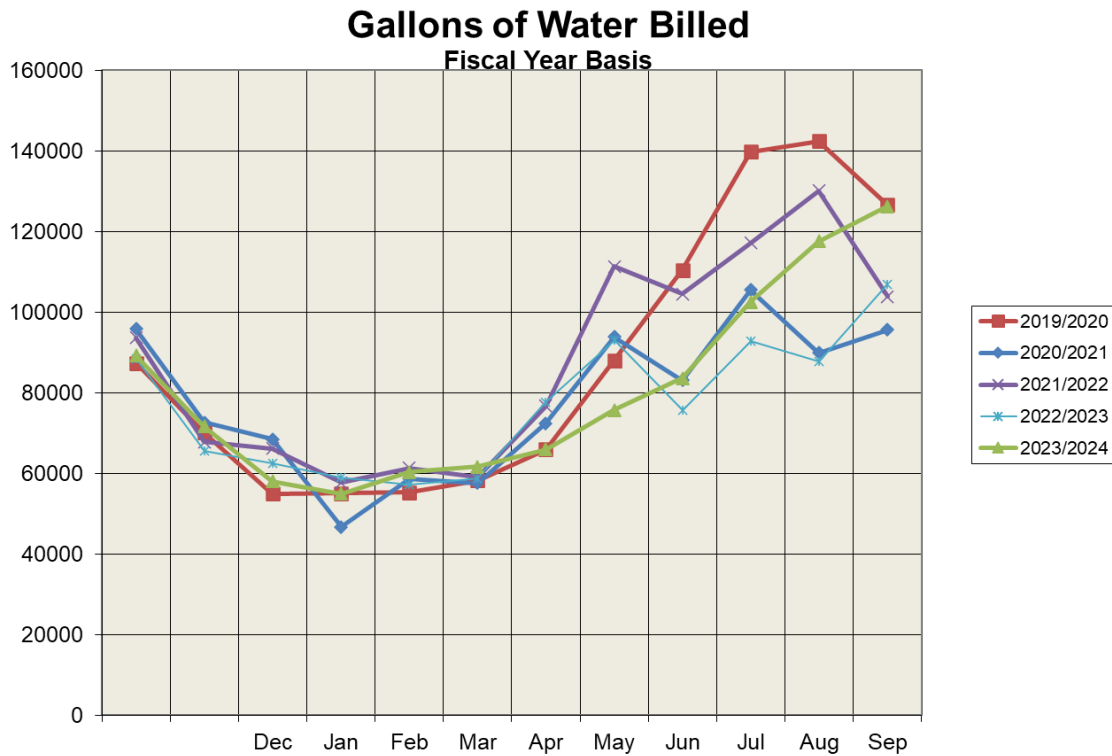

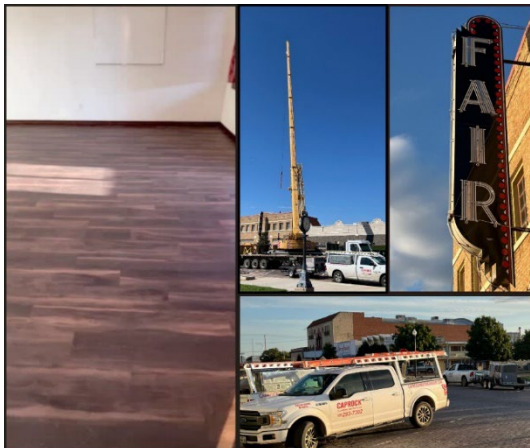
Downtown Plainview September 2nd Saturday
