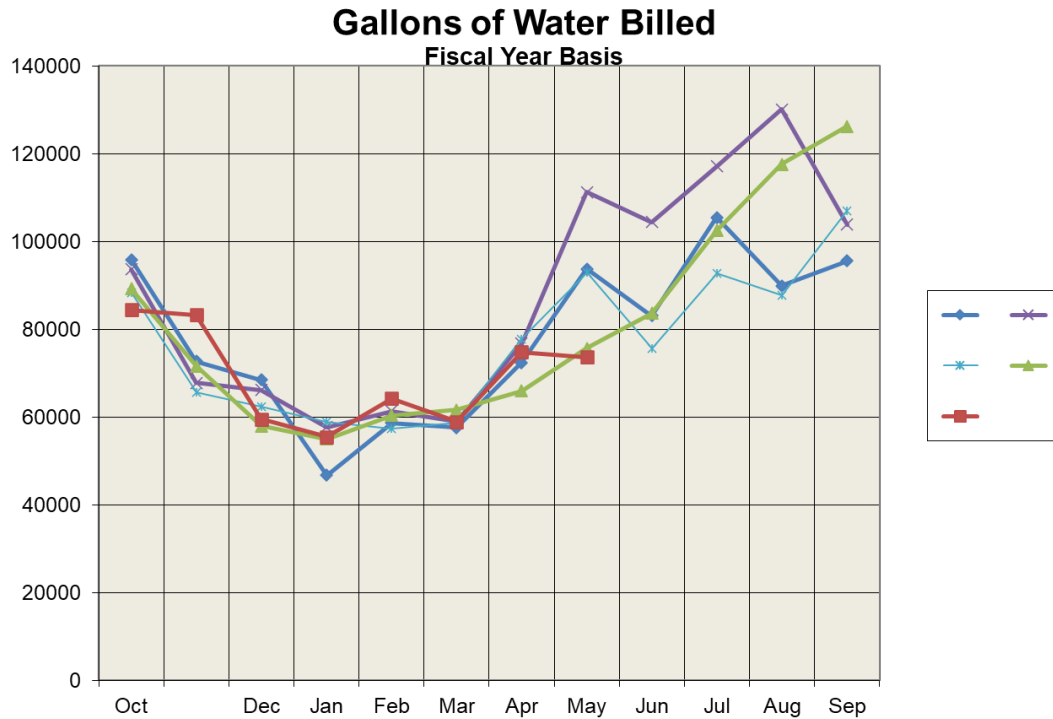

Main Street

On Saturday, May 3rd, the Downtown Plainview Main Street Design Committee and Plainview National Art Honor Society Students completed a long-planned window mural on 612 Ash. This mural was the product of the Main Street 2024-2026 Work Plan Window Activation Strategy, designed to engage vacant or underutilized properties in Downtown to stimulate economic activity and install “temporary” Public Art. The mural, designed by the Honor Society students, represents all of Plainview High School and the pride of being a Plainview Bulldog. The work took 8 hours to complete with 10 students completing the art who were guided by local artists part of the Design Committee including Juanetta Bocko, Angel Azua, and Rigo Rey. This project was funded by a donation by Texas Tech Civic Leadership Academy to create more Public Art in Downtown.



Fair Theater

The Fair Theater hosted a number of events in May including a National Day of Prayer with 50 attendees on May 1st and a field trip from North Elementary of 4th grade students.

Additionally, the Unger Memorial Library hosted two events at the Fair Theater. One of these was on May 6th for a free showing of the PBS Documentary over Public Libraries. This documentary spoke of the importance of Public Libraries and how they are innovating with the growth of community and technology. Cynthia Peterson, City Librarian, was featured in interviews and held a Q&A after the showing. Their second event was an author event for Texas South Plains War Stories with Larry Williams. They spoke on the stories of Veterans from the South Plains and Hale County.

Our shorter Saturday hours began on Memorial Day weekend. We will be open 10:00 am – 2:00 pm each Saturday during the summer months through Labor Day weekend.

We had two adult events in May. One was held on Tuesday, May 6th at the Fair Theatre and was sponsored by PBS out of Lubbock. They showed the film “Free for All” which was a documentary about the history of public libraries and librarians. There was a trailer that was shown beforehand that featured the librarian at the Tahoka Library as well as the librarian and a staff member from Unger Memorial Library talking about their missions, challenges, and strengths. The second event was to be held on Saturday, May 10th, but unfortunately no one from the general public showed up. It was to have been a program regarding veterans, including information on the Texas South Plains Honor Flights which take veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the various memorials for the different wars. We want to try to rebook this one at a later date.

The Summer Reading Program kickoff event was held on Saturday, May 31st and included arts & crafts, games, and bubbles! We had about 44 in attendance between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

A purge of the patron list occurred in mid-May. This included patrons whose card had expired on or before December 31, 2019. All patrons were deleted except for those still owing fees for lost or damaged materials.
