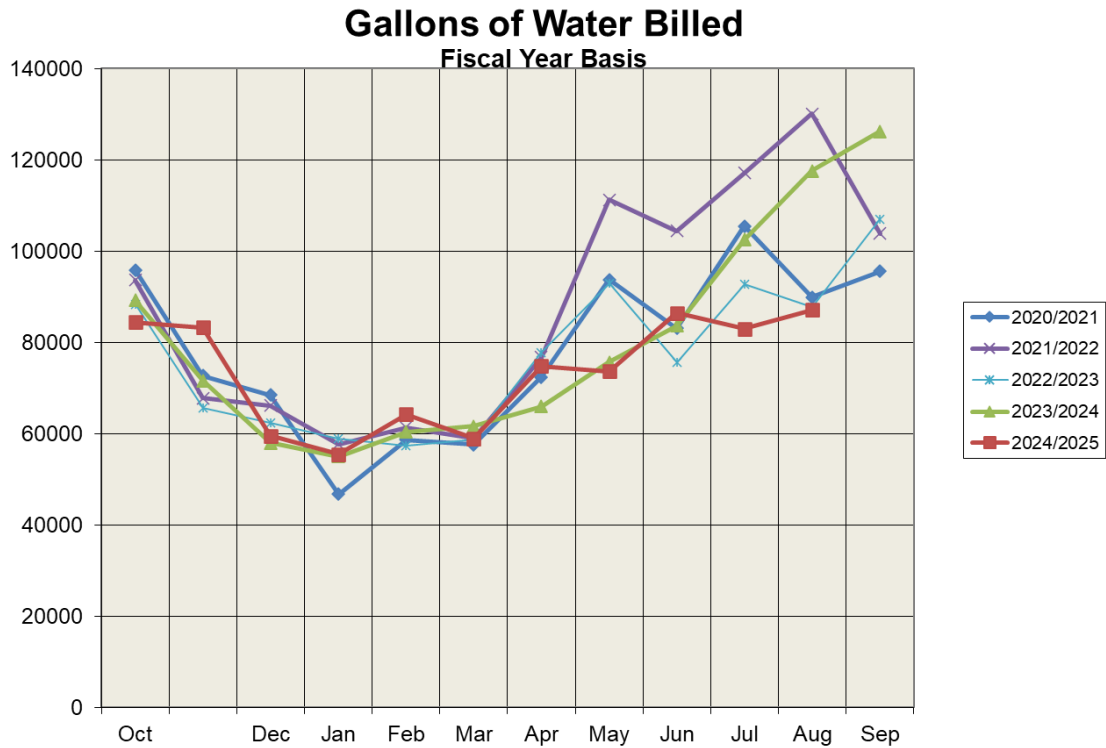

August is usually a slower month in the library as families gear up for the beginning of the school year and others go off to college/university. This is reflected in a slight decrease in most things, from number of visitors to circulation. The exception is that we saw an increase in e-book and streaming audiobook usage through E-Read Texas.
