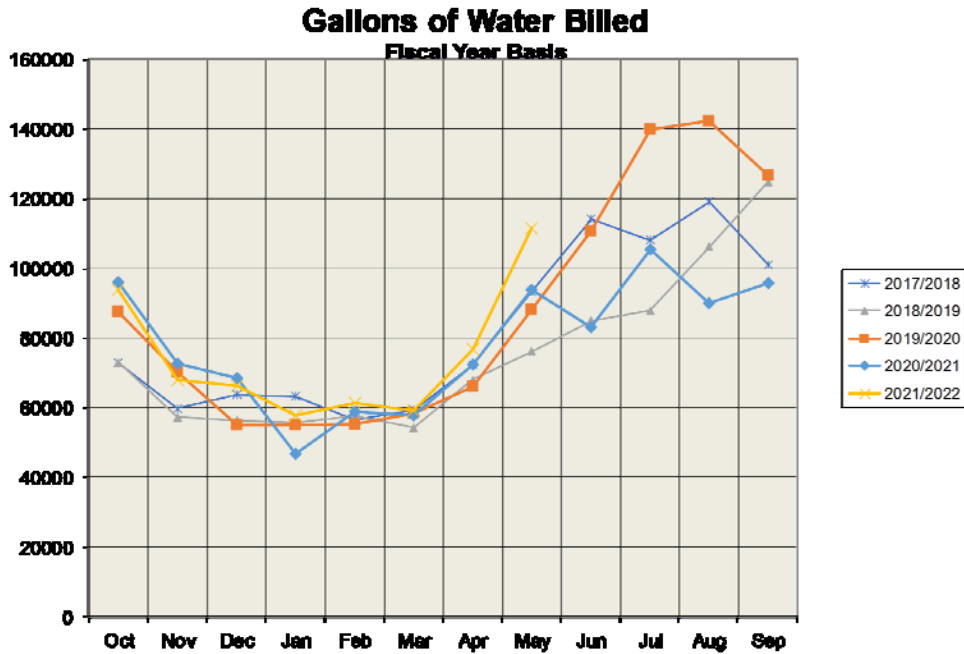

Summer hours begin after Memorial Day Weekend.

We continue to register patrons for the Summer Reading Program. This will continue through June 15th. Those not registered are still invited to attend our programs, but they will be ineligible for reading credits, certificates, and any prizes awarded at the end of the program.

According to the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) every accredited library should purge former patrons every three years. It is unknown if this has ever been done at Unger Memorial Library, so at the end of this fiscal summer that will be done. We expect there will be a significant drop in the total number of patrons registered as these totals include old cards no longer in use, patrons who have moved or who are deceased, as well as patrons who have simply let their cards lapse. We will only purge patrons who have cards that are beyond the expiration date on the card by 3 years.

The Library Board met on May 10, 2022 for the first time since new members were appointed by the City Council. Emily Bolinger was elected the new Chair of the Board.
