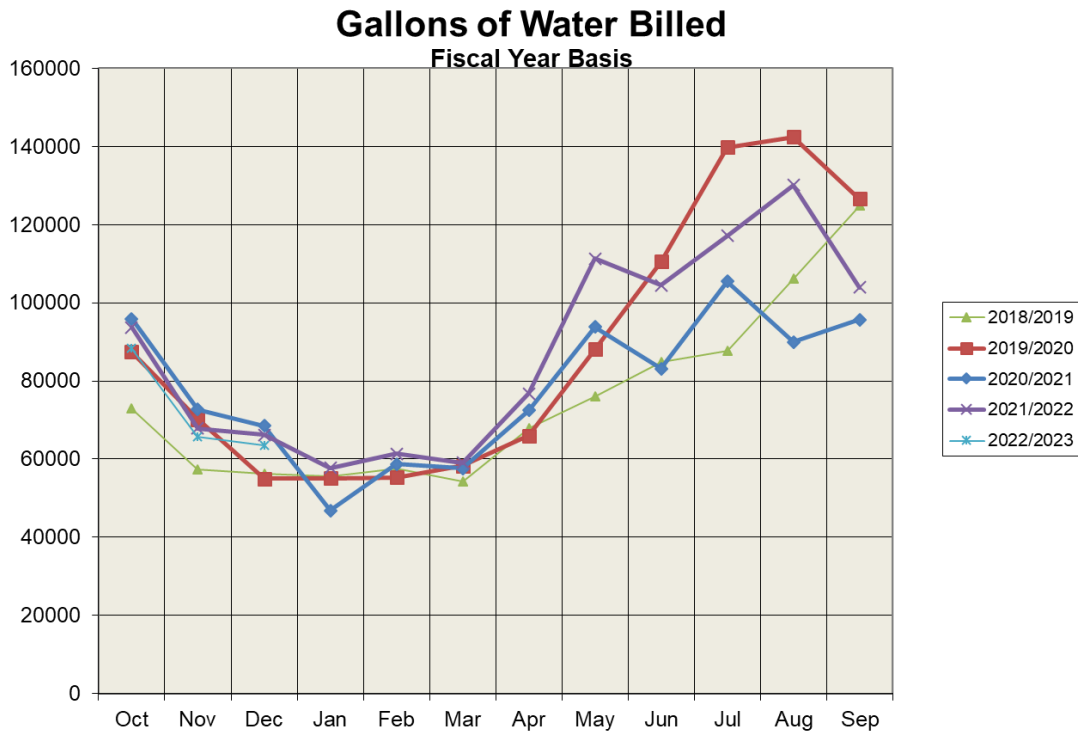

5. Conducted routine street sweeping in residential and commercial areas.
6. Conducted routine traffic sign maintenance and trained employees on sign maintenance.
7. Conducted structure demo at 6th & Quincy.
8. Set up and maintained a traffic work zone site on W. 24th St. for asphalt repair.
9. Conducted preventative maintenance and repair service for equipment: tractor, sign trailer, and riding lawn mower.
10. Hauled backfill soil and leveled the property at 6th & Quincy after demolition.

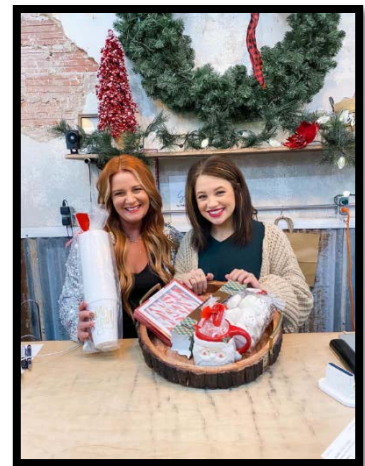
